# who may attend

ISIS members who are interested in or are currently practicing spine intervention medicine and/or spine injection techniques can attend. This course is specifically designed for all skill levels. Members who have not taken an ISIS bio-skills lab previously are encouraged to being their training with this course.

In accordance with new guidelines recommended by the education committee and adopted by the board of directors, the following specialties only may enroll in this course: Anesthesiology, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, Radiology, Neurology, Orthopedic Surgery and Neurosurgery. Members who wish to discuss this protocol must contact the ISIS office.

# course goals

The field of spine intervention is rapidly changing due to increased knowledge of patient outcomes, advances in therapeutic techniques and new treatment technology. The overall goals of this course are to enhance patient care by providing participants with information and skill building exercises developed on an evidence-based approach to spine pain. ISIS incorporates a comprehensive approach in the diagnosis and treatment of patients with spine pain and this course includes: anatomy, imaging, techniques, risks, or compilations and outcomes. Time is provided for one-on-one faculty interaction and participant questions.

# educational objectives

Upon completion of this program participants should be able to:

- Interpret patient history including radiographic findings to develop a differential diagnosis of a patient's spine pathology
- Understand physical examination findings related to pre and post procedure effects
- Develop an appropriate diagnostic and therapeutic algorithm for spine and radicular pain
- Discuss controversies related to diagnostic and therapeutic intervention
- Demonstrate appropriate skills for performing the spinal procedures discussed in the lectures and workshop
- Identify the risks and benefits of each procedure, as well as prevention, assessment, and treatment of potential complications

Cervical Techniques will include:

- Interlaminar
- Transforaminal
- Medial Branch Block/Intraarticular Zygapophysial Joint
- C1-2 (A-A) Joint

Lectures and Didactic Stations will include:

- Spinal Anatomy
- Radiological Imaging
- Patient Selection
- Case Presentations
- Complications & Management

ISIS bio-skill workshops are created to enhance physician understanding of the complexity of performing these procedures. ISIS advises participants to continue to have proctoring, mentoring and additional experience prior to treating patients.

# course description

This **13-hour** rigorous workshop on cervical procedures provides lectures, group didactics, hands-on-bio-skills training, and Q&A time to provide a full understanding of patient care. Utilizing experienced faculty from multiple disciplines, the course's unique organizational protocol provides an intimate and continuous opportunity for participants to improve their knowledge of patient selection, relevant techniques and outcome.
